Pass Extravaganza!!!!

Here are a few tips for everyone regarding the process of getting passes to gain access onto military bases. We understand that it can be frustrating waiting for a pass to process, but the process can take upwards of 3 weeks to complete after ASI turns the paperwork in.

In order for us to process a personal pass we need your current name, address, social security number, date of birth, place of birth, Naturalization/Alien Registration Number, if applicable, and the country you were born in. If any of this information changes it is VERY important that you inform the main office for future purposes as soon as possible.

For vehicle passes, we will need your current registration and safety check as well as proof of Hawaii no-fault insurance. You will be required to present all of this information with a valid driver's license in order to get your vehicle pass at the Pass & I.D. Office.

We can process passes more efficiently with proper documentation and your cooperation.
